SENIOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH UNIT

Offering Dignity to Patients and Their Families

“It was a perfect storm in life,” says John Parolin. In late 2019, his father, also John Parolin, was diagnosed with Alzheimer-Dementia. Then COVID-19 hit, and on Labor Day 2020, John fell and needed emergency surgery on his hip. He was then moved from independent living with his wife at their retirement community to nursing care.

“COVID protocols found him isolated, with no in-person family visits. Even his wife couldn’t come to see him,” remembers John. “We communicated through windows.” There was a rapid decline in John’s cognition due to his isolation. Doctors recommended hospitalization and a review of his medication protocols.

“I was a member of St. Joseph Hospital’s Board of Directors and part of the team who approved the development of its new Senior Behavioral Health Unit,” says John. “For me, it was a no-brainer to seek to have my father admitted to St. Joseph’s. I knew he’d be expertly taken care of, and it would be nice to have him right in Nashua.” Coincidentally, John was among the first admitted to the new SBHU when it opened in December 2020.

Unfortunately, the discussion turned to end-of-life care. “It’s a difficult decision to make, and it was even harder to make it on my own,” says John. “Dr. Jodi Marshall, the director of the SBHU, was amazing. We did a Zoom call with my four siblings and me. She took the time to answer all of our questions and reassure us that this was a compassionate step to take. I had the support of professionals and my family, which helped ease the path forward.”

“We all know that it’s been unusually challenging to work in health care over the past couple of years. But that was not a factor for the staff who showed true compassion to my grandfather and our family,” notes Joanna Poulin, John’s granddaughter.

“The way in which Grandpa’s dignity was consistently upheld was absolutely beautiful. We should all be treated with dignity.”

“The other day I saw a commercial for St. Joe’s on television,” says John. “It closes with the comment ‘I’ve never worked anywhere where I felt like family.’ When caring for my father, they brought us into their family — the St. Joe’s family.”



Commit to Get Fit Event Supports Senior Mental Health

Thank you to everyone who ran, walked, donated or sponsored St. Joseph Hospital's first annual *Commit to Get Fit* 5K/10K on September 19, 2021.

Together, we raised over \$82,000 to benefit the new Senior Behavioral Health Unit. The goal of this unit is to enhance the quality of life for elders in our community with behavioral illness and help their caretakers address the mental health issues that adversely impact elders' lives. All race proceeds were dedicated to the future expansion of this already busy unit.

"As we expand the number of people we can serve in the psychiatric unit, elders living with mental illness who may require our services also grows," explained Maria Jackson, MD. "St. Joe's, ever ready to respond to this need, will look to expand our unit to 28 beds in the near future to better serve this ever-growing population."

In addition to supporting a great cause, the event was also a fun new way to bring our community together. Both hospital workers and community members were happy to join the challenge. Many participants even created race teams or dressed in costume. The Case Management team at the hospital, for example, created a group called the Chaos Coordinators.

"In health care, and especially in COVID times, there is little to no time to socialize with our co-workers," said Kristine Howard, manager of outpatient care coordination and a member of the Chaos Coordinators team.



"We felt it was important to spend time with our co-workers outside the hospital/office setting. Participating in this event helped build camaraderie among our team, and we also met team family members, new babies and even a few pups!" she added. "*Commit to Get Fit* was a wonderful community event that helped raise money to meet the needs of our community. We are also very proud of our social worker, Eric Leader, who won the 10K! We were all honored to represent our department and share in this special day."



THE POWER OF PINK

New Technology Purchased With Funds From Pink Ride & Flamingo Fundraiser

The past year was a busy one for the St. Joseph's Breast Care Center — we completed 9414 mammograms! With more members of our community seeking breast care, 2021 was the perfect time to make sure that our radiologists had every tool they needed to provide compassionate, timely and state-of-the-art care. Thanks to breast care center donors like you, our radiologists now have the best technology available!

Do you remember when you went to the library and scheduled a reading room to review microfiche or use a resource that you couldn't easily check out and bring home? If so, you can appreciate the convenience and flexibility that comes from accessing these kinds of resources from computers in our offices and homes.

The same is true for the radiologists who read mammograms and scans for our patients. Traditionally, our six radiologists would have to use a special reading room or radiology suite

in the Breast Care Center to review test results — and each room had space for one radiologist at a time. This meant that radiologists had to reserve the space. This was difficult if they needed more time or were called away from their reading.

Thanks to a recent upgrade to the Picture Archiving Systems (PACs), St. Joe's radiologists can now read patient mammograms and scans on their own workstations — wherever they are located! And, with the improved technology, mammograms are now visible in 3D.

It's a true game changer for everyone.

In 2021 we also added a new Barco 12-megapixel computer monitor for Kira Wendorf, MD, medical director of the Breast Care Center. This state-of-the-art monitor was created specifically for reading mammograms. The expanded size of the unit enables Dr. Wendorf to see the entire breast scan on one screen, rather than tile by tile. Since mammograms require the very highest resolution of any health care imaging, this innovation added a new level of expertise to the center's diagnostic services.

Thanks to our generous donors and these significant technology upgrades, our amazing Radiology and Breast Care Center teams are well equipped and ready to serve every member of our community who visits us.

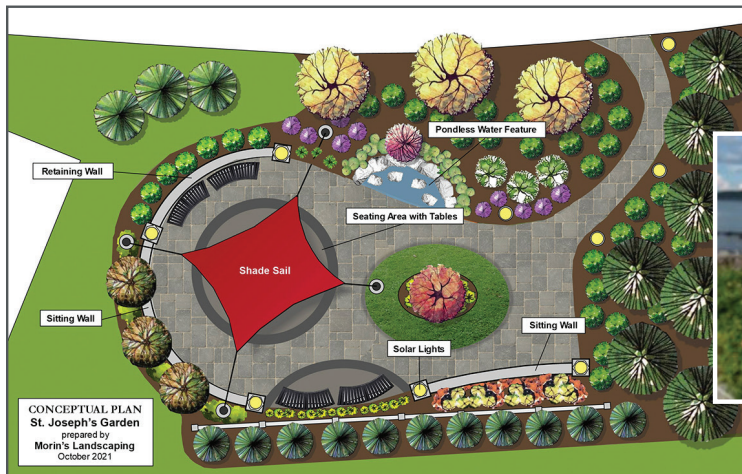
10th Annual Pink Ride

If you've recently visited the rehabilitation garden off the main parking lot, you'll notice it looks a bit neglected. Julie Desmarais, a St. Joseph Hospital volunteer for 27 years, remembers when it was first planted.

"Twenty-seven years ago, my mom, Lucille Blanchette, was a patient at St. Joseph Hospital," remembers Julie. "When she passed away, I signed up to volunteer to help work through my grief. Today I'm still a volunteer." In honor of her mother, who had been a prolific gardener, Julie donated three truckloads of flowers from her mother's garden to spruce up the area.

After serving as a quiet oasis for many over the years, the garden space is ready for a complete refresh. Plans are in place to transform the space into a new commemorative courtyard as a tribute to the St. Joseph Hospital staff and their tireless efforts throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

Daniel O'Donnell, husband of employee Cathy O'Donnell, NP, saw how hard his wife and her colleagues were working during the pandemic. He wanted to do something to recognize them and let them know how much they are appreciated. Familiar with the healing power of nature, Dan thought a commemorative courtyard would be the perfect way to acknowledge their service.

"We are very excited about creating what will be a long-lasting and beautiful reflection garden, dedicated to the health care heroes who have worked tirelessly through the COVID-19 pandemic as well as to the memory of the souls who passed," say Dan and Cathy. "This area will provide solace to those who need a quiet moment and serve as a beautiful venue for hospital and community outreach events."

We are grateful for the O'Donnell's leadership gift of \$10,000 and their dedication to making this commemorative courtyard a reality. St. Joseph Hospital senior management matched their gift to the courtyard in honor of their staff.

The courtyard will include plantings and perennial flowers that were donated to the original garden many years ago — including ones from Julie's mother's garden — in an effort to keep this special piece of St. Joseph's history alive. With shaded and sunny areas, seating and gathering space, the new outdoor area will lend itself to small meetings, enjoying a lunch with a friend or even an open-air yoga session. We're confident it will be a place of joy, peace and reflection for our staff, patients and community members.

Kim Badessa, who nominated Christina, shares, "Christina has a heart of gold. She has an amazing ability to connect with anyone she meets, listening intently and making that person feel valued. As part of her daily tasks, she calls each patient scheduled for a stress test, reviews the process and instructions that pertain to the patient, and answers any questions they may have. Many times, patients express their fear of having a medication stress test. She never rushes any patient and explains why the doctor feels the test is necessary. She also provides education so the patient is comfortable with their decision on whether or not to proceed.

"My favorite part of my job is making a difference in patient lives every single day. I'm proud to have recently earned my master's degree to become a nurse practitioner."

HELPING OUR NEWEST HEALTH CARE HEROES: Bolstering the School of Nursing Scholarship Fund

In 2021, hospitals across the country experienced a shortage of health care workers. Unfortunately, New Hampshire was no exception. However, our community has a distinct advantage that others don't — a School of Nursing, right here in Nashua at St. Joseph Hospital.

The most direct and effective way to overcome the health care provider shortage that impacts us all is to support local students as they focus on mastering the knowledge and skills they need to provide compassionate health care for the whole person: body, mind and spirit. Ninety-three percent of St. Joseph School of Nursing's graduates remain in southern New Hampshire following graduation and subsequent licensure.

In the fall of 2021, benefactors from throughout our community rose to the challenge and matched St. Joseph Hospital President John Jurczyk's \$7,500 gift to the School of Nursing Scholarship Fund. In total, we raised over \$32,000 for student scholarships! In addition, the FACTS company recently donated a special student scholarship in their name.

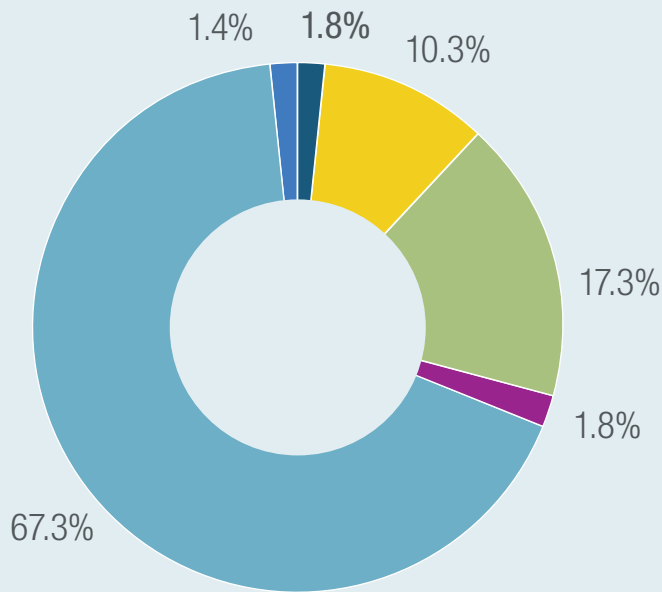

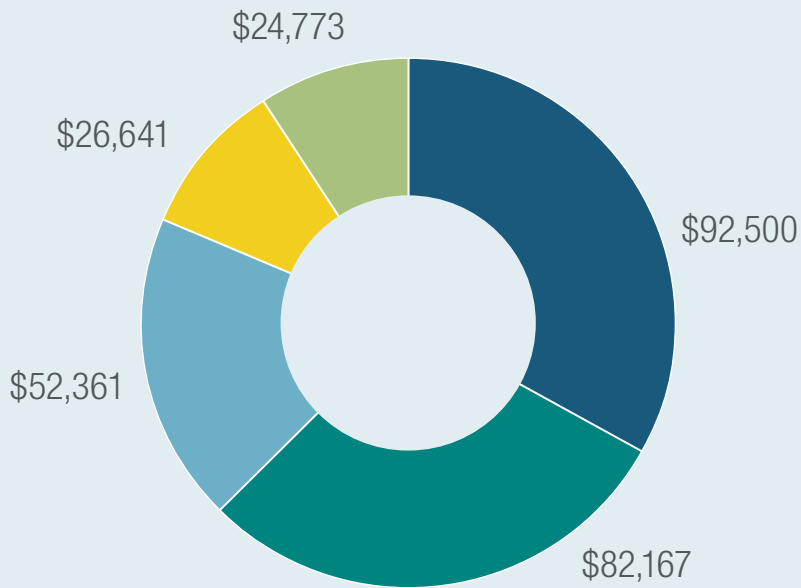

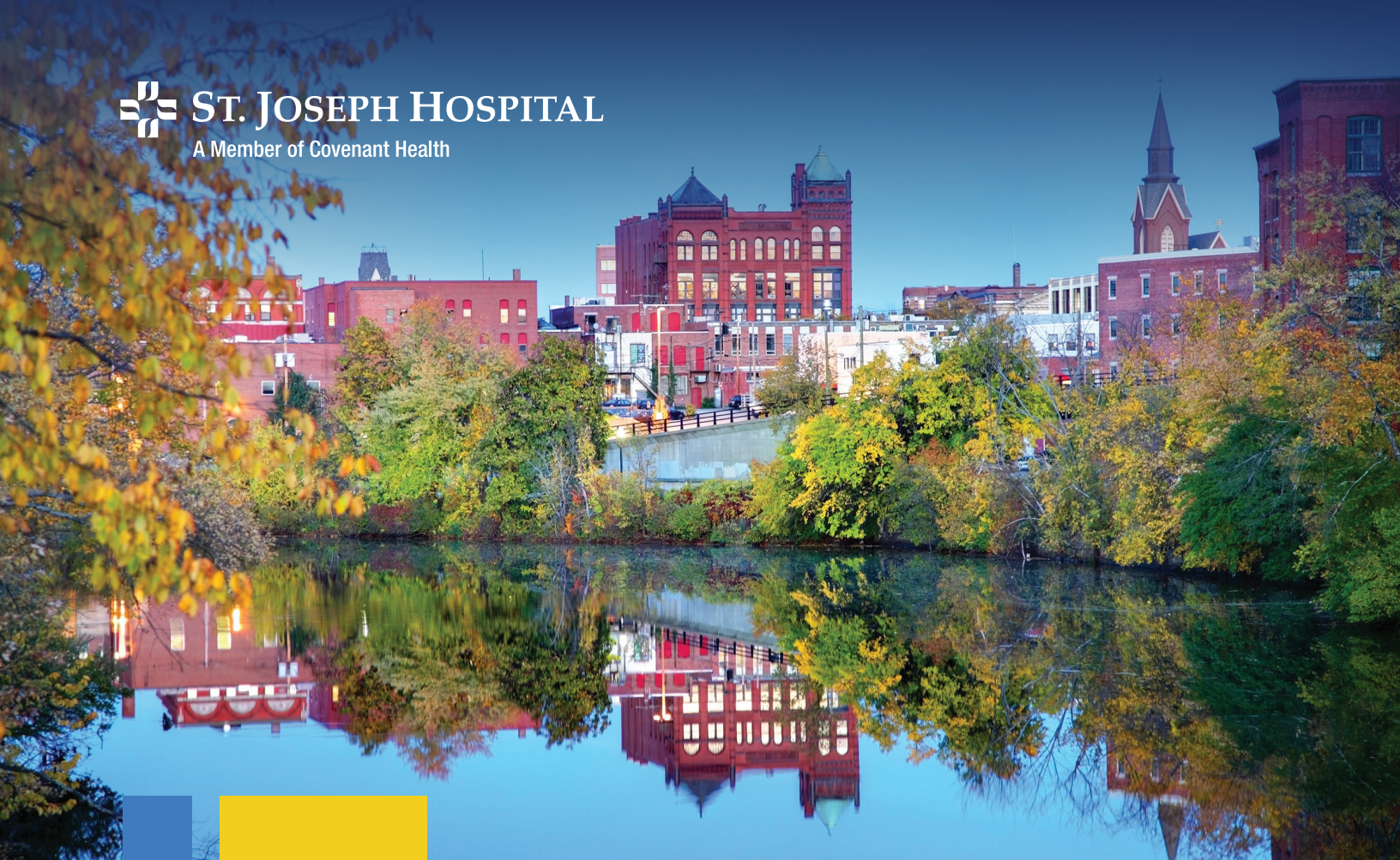
